Dear friends, I do hope you have managed to enjoy the summer months with some opportunity for rest and relaxation. I'm writing this just a few days after our family summer holiday ended with a memorable trip to the Olympic park for the opening night of the World Athletics Championships where we were privileged to see Sir Mo Farah win his final track 10,000m in a thrilling race cheered on by around 60,000 of us. It was a fantastic experience to witness somebody at the end of their track career again achieving their full potential. Before the championships began there had also been a lot of publicity surrounding Usain Bolt as it was his swansong as a sprinting champion. The championships didn't quite work out so successfully for Bolt this time but reflecting on his athletics career as a whole he has said 'God put me on this planet to run and to run fast'. Eric Liddell, whose story is well documented in the film Chariots of Fire, said something very similar.

As we reflect on our lives as disciples of Jesus Christ I wonder if we, like an athlete, have that same sense of purpose and dedication running throughout our being? God has a potential for each one of us; a fullness of life for each one of us to embrace, to live and to run with. The anonymous writer to the Hebrews uses the analogy of life being like a 'race that is set before us' and as we run through life we are to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus who is the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. The apostle Paul tells the people at Corinth that for the sake of the gospel, the prize, they are to 'run in such a way that you may win it'. At times this may feel like hard work. At times we will need to persevere. At other times we might experience the joy of the winning feeling. But only by running our lives of faith will we reach the potential and the fullness that God has in store for us. The final verse of the traditional hymn 'May the mind of Christ my Saviour' says, 'May I run the race before me, strong and brave to face the foe, looking only unto Jesus as I onward go.'
