





- You are over 60.
- You have a disability or chronic illness.
- You are deaf or hard of hearing.
- You are blind or partially sighted.
- You rely on medical equipment that needs a continuous electricity supply.



You are the parent or guardian of a child under the age of 5 who lives with you.

If you are on the register, you can access it for helpful hints should there be a power cut which is highly unlikely i.e., ensure that you have torches to hand etc. Mind you, we have all been through power cuts in the past!!


