

Family Matters Report to CTiF May 2023

We have just passed the first anniversary of the Family's arrival in the UK.

Both the mother and father continue to make progress with their English and attend E.S.O.L. classes at Highbury College.

The father has just started part time work at a local marina and boat yard whose owner has been very co-operative in fitting the hours around his E.S.O.L. classes. Our great thanks to him! The mother is about to start as a volunteer at a local Primary School. This work could be immensely useful to further her prospects of gaining some sort of paid work in the education sector in the future.

The three boys continue with the same work that they started back in May last year. A great tribute to their work ethic and their determination to help support the Family as much as possible. Their progress in English speaking continues apace without the need to attend E.S.O.L. classes.

Through hard work and the help of a family relation the family now own two electric bikes and two cars. All three boys have passed their driving tests whilst the father and mother are still to take their theory and practical tests.

As with so many people in the UK it has not been possible to register any of the family with an NHS dentist. Thankfully we think they may just have secured consultations with an NHS dentist in May. We hope this will progress into them being accepted as NHS patients.

There have been no issues with the house. The willingness of the Investment Trust to rent the property at well below market rate does a great deal to help the Family budget their income.

I don't think a year ago we could have possibly predicted how far the family would have come in terms of operating independently in their new life in the UK. This is not typical of families in the Community Sponsorship programme.

The fundraising by the group before the Family arrived along with the donations made by members of CTiF means our funds are still healthy. This has meant we have been able to offer financial support to the Family in achieving even greater independence (e.g., passing driving tests and private dental appointments).

The passing of a year since they arrived marks the end of our formal contract to support the family. In discussion with the family, we will now draw up an 'exit plan' which details any further things the family would like to achieve before our support ends. However, the support will continue until the family consider it is no longer needed or we feel we can do no more for them.



Sunday Worship Tech Changes

Things are changing from a technical perspective for Sunday morning worship, and we wanted to keep everyone up to date with what is happening.

Since lockdown the amount of work put in by a few people in producing hymn words and content weekly to display on the screen at the front of the Church has been significant, averaging 1.5-2 hours each week, and this has restricted the number of people able to support the Tech. It has therefore been decided to make some changes to the way we worship.

Firstly, we will be returning to the use of Hymn Books and only use the screen for Hymn words where the song is not in Singing the Faith.

Also, we will not be providing Zoom access on a regular basis, but streaming the services through Facebook.



We have been carrying out some trials and are aware that we still have teething issues, but we have been reaching between 40 and 50 people watching the service, either live or via the recording. These are members who have not attended the service but also many people from outside the Church. Gaining access for Facebook Live is easy, and you don't need an account. Go to the Fareham Methodist Church Facebook page and look for the service within the posts. You can still do this even if you don't have a Facebook account.

We are also aware of sound issues with the microphone system, and we are working with a supplier to make improvements.

The changes are taking place to try to improve everyone's enjoyment of Sunday worship, but also reduce the workload and technical capability required allowing more people to get involved and support the small tech team.


