Take care and thanks again.



Dear friends,

You will all be aware that for churches (and many other charities and voluntary organisations) the last three years have been tough. The pandemic changed the landscape for so many of us and it is only now that we are beginning to see the full impact of it on ourselves, our community and our country as a whole.

At Fareham Methodist Church it feels like normal service has, more or less, been resumed. Our church life feels busy again and most of our groups and activities are up and running and new things are happening. Sundays feel equally as busy as the majority of folk have been able to return to 'on site' worship whilst we also have some regular Zoomers too. It is a good place to be! However, I think if we are to grasp one opportunity that the pandemic has given us, it is to pause and think about the future of our church and how we might best serve one another and the wider community that we are a part of. Grasping opportunities inevitably means considering change. Invariably, as a creature of habit who likes routine, I find the prospect of change both challenging and exciting; daunting but also life-giving. I wonder how you feel about it.

We're all going to be encountering change as we move towards the middle of the year as I prepare to leave here, and you prepare to welcome Rev Pauline Crispin as your new minister from September 2023. At the most recent meetings of Worship Consultation and Church Council it was felt that the time was right to begin to think about the future of the church, to do a bit of preparatory work in the next few months so that Pauline will be able to pick this up with you in the autumn. So, to this end, we would like to give some time at our Annual Church Meeting, which will be after the morning service on the 26th March, for some discussion about the future. We want as many folk as possible to be part of these discussions and I hope the questions below are helpful to aid your thinking and praying in preparation for our time together.

What do we want our church life to look like in 5 (or even longer) years' time?

Are there some things that need to change?

Are there some things that we need to stop doing so that we can start something else?

What things about our worshipping life do you enjoy and find meaningful? What things would you like to change or see more of?

What new opportunities might there be to serve our local community?

How can our building be better used during the week - a '7 day a week' church?

This is by no means an exhaustive list but a starting point. There are no right, wrong, or easy answers! As a church community we journey together, in the presence of God, whose Holy Spirit aids us in discerning how we might witness to the good news of Jesus Christ that is at the heart of our faith.

Thank you for all that each of you brings to our church life. Let's hope and pray for fruitful discussion that begins to shape a collective vision for the future.

Update on Warm Spaces



Dear friends

Since the beginning of December, Christians Together in Fareham (CTiF) have been offering a Warm Welcome Space every weekday at a number of our church premises across the town. In the autumn, when we developed this response to the news of increasing costs of living, particularly energy costs, CTiF agreed that the overall project would be evaluated at the end of January.

CTiF met last week to discuss the experience and learning, with reports back from each Space. Across most of the churches taking part, the experience was similar with just an occasional visitor, and those churches who used an existing community session to offer a Warm Welcome Space have not added significantly to their number of participants.

One notable exception is Hill Park Baptist Church who offered lunch and have regularly attracted 7-10 visitors with numbers gradually increasing. Anecdotally, it is thought some visitors were former users of The Hub and we know that the Social Prescribers from the Highlands Practice have helped encourage people to attend. CTiF members noted that the centre of town is well served by the library, which is also a designated Warm Welcome Space.

The conclusion that we have reached is that Hill Park Baptist Church (Monday and Friday 11am to 2pm) will continue and the sessions at St John's (Tuesday morning) and Sacred Heart (Tuesday afternoon) will continue to be drop-ins/coffee mornings as they were originally. The United Reformed Church, Fareham Baptist New Life Church and Holy Trinity will cease the project this week, prior to the half term school holidays.

We have been encouraged and grateful that so many members of our church congregations have responded to making the Warm Welcome project happen with minimal lead-in time. This has included the process of making our buildings safe and welcoming including risk assessments, safeguarding training and of course, publicity and awareness raising.

The project has been an act of faith - a worthwhile experience for all involved and our churches have learned very much individually and collectively, informing our mission activities in the future. We have raised the profile of Christians Together in Fareham across a range of media and local voluntary organisations in our town and the Borough Council have also been supportive.

Please express our heartfelt thanks to all who have supported this initiative.


