Dear Friends,

The end of May saw a crescendo in the church year as we celebrated Pentecost and then Trinity Sunday. The former a reminder of the gift of the Holy Spirit after Jesus had ascended into heaven and the latter a celebration of how God is revealed to us as creator, redeemer and sustainer. And now, after all that, we take a deep breath and enter a long period of what the church calls 'ordinary time' (it officially begins on Trinity Sunday) until we enter Advent at the end of November. The phrase 'ordinary time' makes me smile. It seems such a banal title to use to describe what is the majority of the church year (between 33 and 34 weeks in all). Of course the term 'ordinary' comes from the fact that it isn't Advent or Lent; Christmas or Epiphany; Easter or Pentecost for these are the high days and high times of the year. In some ways it can be easier to find God in the high days and special celebrations. But the challenge for us now is to find God in the ordinary and everyday.

Not long ago I was called out to visit a lady in a nursing home who was filled with despair at the bleak future that lay ahead of her. My prayer for her was that God would break through her pain and bring some love and joy into her situation. The next time I visited her I was greeted by a lady with a smile on her face and thankfulness in her heart. She had just taken delivery of a special chair that meant she was no longer confined to her bed. With support she was able to sit in her chair and be wheeled out of the four walls of her room and into the spacious lounge where she could interact with other people. Who would have thought that something as ordinary and everyday as a chair would be the answer to that prayer! Sometimes God chooses the everyday things and the most ordinary of people to break through into our ordinary and everyday lives with his ex-

traordinary presence and remind us again of his interest in **all** of our living.

May this 'ordinary time' be special time for us as we wait upon a God of traordinary things. With Love, Claire

Church entrance access control

You will have noticed recently some additional cables and switches have been installed adjacent to the Welcome area and Scout Shop entrances. This is in preparation for a new access system being installed.

At their January meeting, the Church Council agreed to the installation of a new locking system for the Church, this will do away with the current keys, and all key holders will be issued with a key-fob.

There has been questions from our insurance company for some time regarding the number of keys we have, and as the current key locks have been in place for some 15 - 20 years, it was decided that time had come to review the whole access system. Introducing the new system will also help us with compliance for safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults.

Currently everyone with a key can access the building 24 hours a day, whether they need to or not. With the new system we can restrict access as appropriate, e.g. if you only have a meeting on a Wednesday between 2 & 4pm, you will only have access at that time. Obviously we will discuss individual requirements when the time comes.

Phase one of the work is now complete, and a magnetic lock has been installed on the Scout Shop entrance. This is initially for the Trinity Pre-School's use only, and complies with a requirement from the Fire officer.

The next job is to install new entrance doors in the Welcome area, and once this is complete we will then start the changeover process to key fobs.

SUPPORT THE VULNERABLE

Leaders from four major UK Churches (including the Methodist Church) have signed an open letter to the re-appointed Prime Minister, David Cameron, encouraging him to hold 'truth, justice, peace and wellbeing' at the heart of the government.



With a focus on 'loving our neighbour', the letter reminds the Prime Minister that a wholesome society should be concerned for the weakest and most vulnerable, both locally and globally.

The letter, signed by leaders of the Baptist Union of Great Britain, the Church of Scotland, the Methodist Church and the United Reformed Church, highlights several of the key concerns that the Churches believe should be high on the agenda of the new government, calling for:

a full review of the impact of the benefits sanctions system; a postponement of further spending on Trident and a serious reassessment of the need for nuclear weapons;

assertive international action to uphold human rights and deliver humanitarian assistance in Syria;

action to make freedom of religion a human rights priority in all aspects of foreign policy.

"Remembering our neighbours is vital for a healthy society," said Rachel Lampard, leader of the Joint Public Issues Team, which works on behalf of the Churches. "Whilst policies protecting the most weak and vulnerable of society may not always be the most popular, they are necessary to live out the common good, regardless




