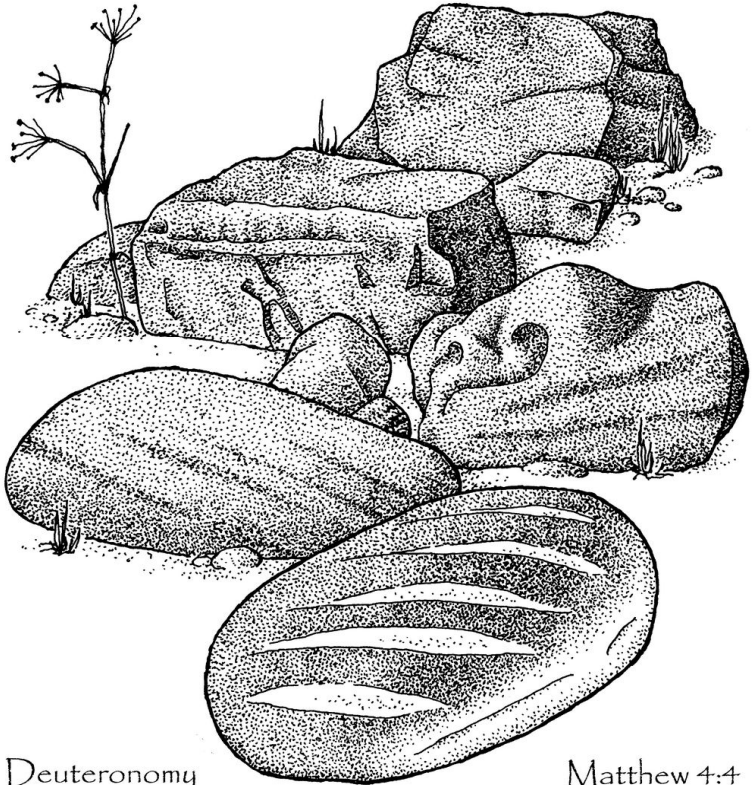

Dear friends,

It feels like Easter is very early this year. No sooner have we mulled over the message of Christmas and Epiphany we are thrown into the events that encourage us to follow Jesus' journey to the cross and beyond. So, our Lenten journey begins on the 10<sup>th</sup> February – see vestry jottings for the details of the Ash Wednesday service for our section of the Circuit. We are also a part of the ecumenical Lent groups for this year – again, see details on page 10.

I have written before about the season of Lent and explained that I am not someone who generally gives something up. You could argue that that is a bit of a 'cop out'. I could try a ban on chocolate and see what happened. Or caffeine. I suspect that when Easter Day arrives I would just go back to eating chocolate and drinking coffee and that would be that. Our President of Conference, Rev Steve Wild, has called us to relent from drinking alcohol (if you are not teetotal already) and for some this may work, but for those who only ever drink in moderation I'm not quite sure what that would achieve.

Whatever we choose to do in this penitential season of Lent it should *change us* for the better – and it should be a sustainable change that takes us well beyond Easter Day so that we don't then just go back to old, unhelpful and unhealthy patterns of life. I would want to suggest that because it *changes us* it also impacts on others too – it maybe makes something in our families or our local community, or our world, a little better, a little bit more positive. Mahatma Gandhi said 'Be the change you wish to see in the world'. However you choose to acknowledge this season of Lent then go well and be willing to change as you allow God to work in you his will and way as we journey to the cross.

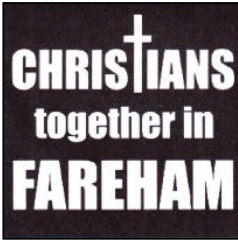

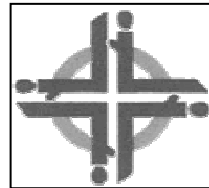
We have a policy of delivering in mid-afternoon so the toys can be hidden before children come home from school.

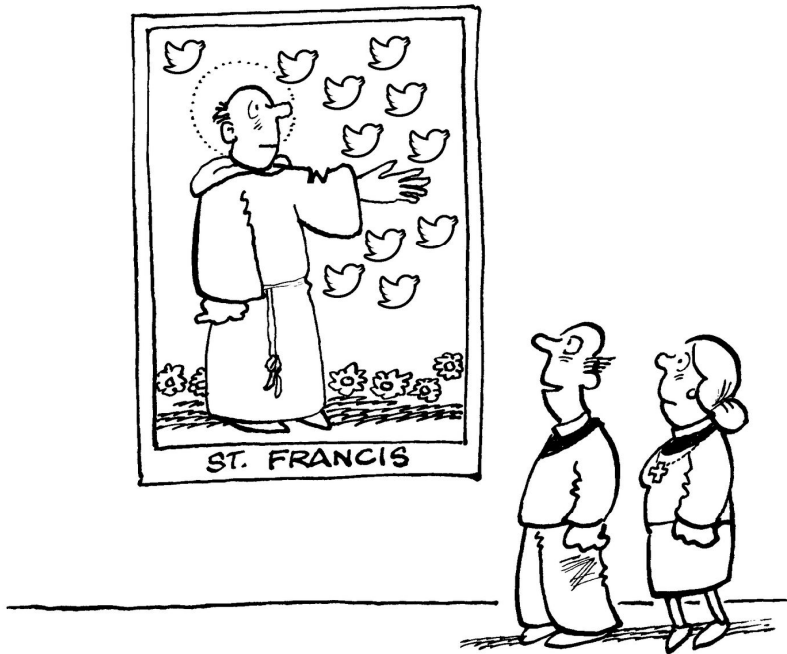

# CIRCUIT NEWS

An extract from the East Solent and Downs Circuit Newsletter of Dec 2015

## Stationing, Staff & Officer News

Hart Plain, Horndean, Midhurst and Petersfield have entered stationing for a Presbyter who will reside at the Manse in Petersfield. Unfortunately, so far, we have not yet been successful in securing a match. The next round will take place in January

The District Policy Executive has approved our proposal for the appointment of Bill Stillwell as an Active Supernumerary from 1st Sept 2016 for a period of 3 years. Bill will serve (60% time) at Bedhampton, Havant and Wymering churches.

Two of our Circuit Ministers will be going on Sabbatical during this Connexional Year. Rev David Muskett – February, March & April and Rev Jeanette Richardson – April, May & June . Support groups have been set up to support them and their families.

Rev John Mills will be ordained next year, following successful completion of his probationary period. There will be a Circuit Pre-Ordination service, date to be confirmed. We recently learnt that two of our circuit members ,Joan Mason and Janet Heys have been elected by District Synod to the annual conference.. Also, Janet Baker has been elected as a District Rep on the Methodist Council.

Garry Bagshaw has been appointed as the Circuit Mission Enabler. Garry is very excited about this challenging role and looks forward to building on the work started earlier this year. As of Sep 1st, John Wardle took over from Philip Warren as Chair of the Manse Committee. Mrs Yvonne Jameson took over from Rev Gillian Slaymaker as Chair of MWiB.

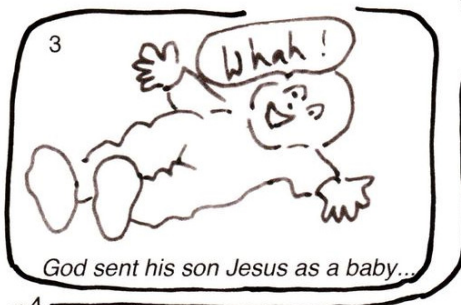
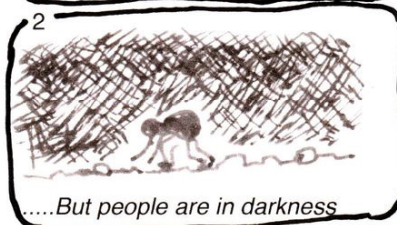
There are just a few places left on the annual Methodist conference for all lay employees and children & youth workers.
