Notes from Christians Together in Fareham (CTiF)

Good news stories

The Community Church, in partnership with the charity 'Practical Tools Initiative', run by James Fallah-Williams (a member of the congregation who is from Sierra Leone) has, over the last year or so, been working to establish in Sierra Leone what was first called 'The School in the Quarry'. This was a way of supporting a group of children, as young as five, who spend their days with their carers stone-breaking in a quarry. Enough money was quickly raised to start the school in a tent and begin paying the head teacher who has been employed to work with the children. However, the project has grown, and work is now under way to build a school on a site (which has already been designated and cleared) for not only the children of the quarry but also for two other neighbouring communities who do not have access to formal education. There are, as of today, 300 children on the books!

Welborne

David Childs reported to CTiF that the planning application, which had been due to be approved in August, is still outstanding for a number of reasons. An application has been made to the United Reformed Church nationally for a pioneer minister to work in Welborne, to include a chaplaincy to the workers building it. Rachel Hicks noted that 'Christians Together' has been involved in the planning process almost since it started, which has been brilliant. David commented that although it is the URC that is most active on this, it is engaging with other denominations and is very open to working with everyone.

Support for asylum seekers

The Ilahi family is still waiting for a decision, and there is a feeling that no news is good news. They are now allowed to engage in voluntary work, which is a step forward. More of the asylum seekers who sign on at Fareham police station are willing to engage with the churches' volunteers at Tesco.

PLAY BOOKS

When I visited my granddaughter and family in the USA in the summer I went to church with them on three Sundays; they are Mormons. I found the service strange, not only because all the hymns were unknown to me but also because there were no prayers or Bible readings. Most odd because these play a daily role in their home. The service lasted about 45 minutes, then there was a break before everybody, adults and children, went to "Sunday School". There was a selection of classes. The ones my grandson-in-law and I went to were discussions led by an elder. The most interesting one for me was about "Play Books".

Let me explain. In American Football (the US game I watch) the coaches of each team have a play book in which there are various strategies which the team have learnt, some for attack, some for defence. At each stoppage the coach relays to the team which strategy he wants them to employ; so they are rehearsed for every situation which arises. The speaker suggested that we, as individuals and as a church, ought to have two play books. In one would be ways in which we could meet setbacks: temptation, affliction, crisis so that we were prepared. In the other would be ways in which we could evangelise whenever there arose an opportunity. It led to a lot of discussion as to what are the biggest strategies for Christians to have both as a Church and as individuals. I found it very interesting to hear their vies, especially as Mormons are very strong on evangelising.

Another discussion was about what changes we should make to keep up with the times.
