

We participated in the Fareham Community Showcase event in the Town centre on Saturday 20th July promoting recycling with Terracyling. We handed out a lot of flyers which were well received. Many discussions were had, and the team were incredibly happy the way the day had gone.

Outside the church, there are two bins for recycling: one blue and one yellow. Both bins accept all recyclable items.

Information from an article in Sunday Times a few weeks ago.

Has everyone noticed the new plastic bottles with caps permanently attached? This is an EU requirement and because it's unproductive to make bottles for the UK, we also have them, but this is a good thing. The world produces 583 billion plastic bottles & therefore caps per year. These caps are now the 5th most common plastic debris in our seas.

These caps are difficult to recycle, not least because they get lost in the recycling process and therefore end up in landfill or worse on our beaches and seas.

These new bottles, with caps attached, are shredded, and separated in a floatation tank. That means million more bottle caps can be recycled rather than ending up strewn across our planet and often in the stomach of our wild animals. Plastic waste is a massive global problem, and every little bit helps even if they are a little irritating.

However, I would recommend reusing bottles as much as possible because sole use plastic is a scourge on God's creation.

Fareham and Gosport Basics Bank Thank you to Fareham Methodist Church for supporting us!

The Fareham and Gosport Basics Bank is the principal project of *Friends of the Homeless in Fareham and Gosport* which is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (Registration number 1194360). The Basics Bank provides food support and relief to those who find themselves in a short-term crisis or emergency. Our aim is not to create dependency but to provide support until the crisis subsides. This represents an outworking of the biblical principle of 'loving your neighbour as yourself'.

This is enabled by operating two food banks which supply food parcels to last for a period of up to a week completely free of charge. We are also able to offer toiletries and nappies. We operate an on-line, cloud-based referral system which is accessed by over 150 agencies. Such prequalification gives some real assurance that service users are receiving help for background issues such as debt, homelessness, mental or physical illness, unemployment and benefit problems.

The agencies include a homeless direct access centre, the women's refuge, social services, health visitors, the probation service, Citizen's Advice, council housing offices, school outreach workers, health visitors, social workers and a number of other charities and others who come into contact with people in severe need or crisis.

We cover the local authority areas of Fareham and Gosport and a part of the City of Winchester area.

We have seen significant growth in demand for food support. In 2023 we handled some 3500 referrals and fed over 8500 people. It is likely that high levels of demand will continue into the foreseeable future.

The level of food and toiletry donations has declined in the recent past and continues to do so. However, we also receive generous support financially which enables us to make up any shortfall and to continue to provide fresh fruit and vegetables, together with bread, eggs and milk. Thus, the charity remains self-sufficient. Our donors include schools, churches, commercial organisations and individuals. We are grateful for all the support we receive.

We currently need - tins of peas, tins of custard, deodorants, jars of sauces for rice, small jars of coffee, corned beef, and tins of fruit

We have enough baked beans, pasta, tinned spaghetti, tinned pulses, and tea

Our volunteers are a significant asset. These are people of faith and no faith who work to achieve the common goal of trying to make a difference to the vulnerable in our community. They do this unstintingly with good humour and great commitment, with compassion, no small degree of sadness and without passing judgement on those whom they help. We are grateful for all they contribute.
