The Fareham Well (the charity established by CTiF and which once ran the Christian café and bookshop in West Street, Fareham) now leases its ground floor property to "The Rainbow Centre" as a charity shop with the rental income going to a new grant-awarding initiative which will be launched in 2024.

A local charity, The Rainbow Centre provides a rehabilitation centre for children and adults with neurological conditions (e.g. cerebral palsy) and relies on donations to keep its shop stocked. 

The Prayer Tree


