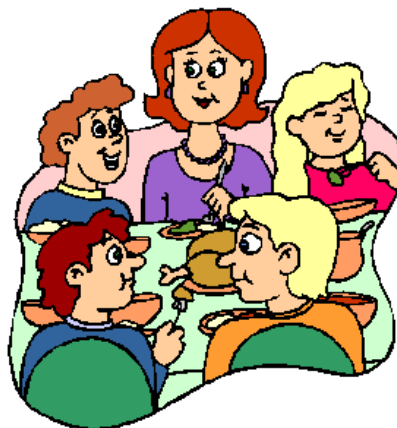
### **The Menu**

I have been a Christians together in Fareham representative for our Church for a long time. I enjoy being with other people from different churches.

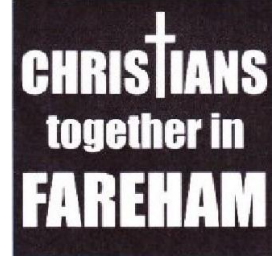

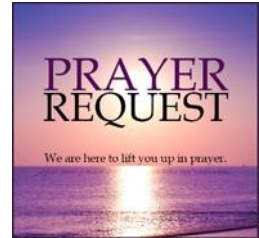
Brownies came and sang carols to everyone at the Christmas Tea Party. Thank you to the Brownies and their parents who brought them along.

# The Prayer Tree

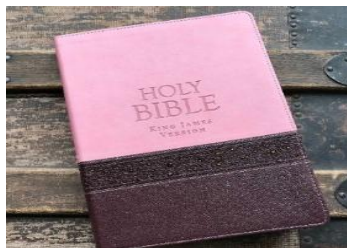

## Guidance for Life?

My grandson's parents have asked family and close friends to offer 'wise guidance for life ahead' so that they can compile a booklet to give to him on the occasion of his 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. This reminded me of an autograph that my best friend's mother put into my book when I was about 11 years old. I did not understand it for years but remembered it word for word as follows:

"We can never learn the lesson too deeply that our actions in the common places of life are deciding our destiny" - F. B. Meyer.

This was the Chat GPT interpretation:

1. In summary, this statement means that:

We should never underestimate how much our everyday choices and behaviours - the small, ordinary things that we do when no one is watching - shape the course of our lives and who we become.
