

CALLING ALL JAM AND JELLY MAKERS

I have two Crab Apple trees ready for picking.
I have muslin.
I have various sizes of jars.

Just ask and it could all be yours.

If anyone would like to make Crab Apple Jelly, you only need to add sugar and water to the mix and once cooked drain through the muslin over night without squeezing to make a delicious jelly.

The left-over flesh and skins are ideal for making chutney. No waste!!! I have in the past added Cranberries or Blueberries to make a lovely, sweet chutney. But Gooseberries, Rhubarb, ordinary Apples etc also make a very tasty chutney. I have at times also added Marrow, Banana, Sultanas, etc as the mood or quantity have inspired me.

TerraCycling is a nonprofit company which approaches or is approached by companies to recycle the plastic from their products.

The reason that there are named programmes is because they pay a percentage of their advertising budget to cover the cost.

Some of the brands have extended their collection e.g. Warburtons will take other plastic bread bags from other companies and firm trays from bakeries including Superstores own products like muffins, brownies and scones.

You will see that in my A5 handouts I have listed each product separately in red, plus the extra plastic in black.

I receive permission to collect a programme which has a minimum weight to be collected before I can send it off. I weigh, pack and send it post free. Looking at the TerraCycle website you will see that King's Rd is a public drop off point.

I have permission to collect 12 programmes and when a box has arrived at TerraCycling I receive points which get exchanged into money for the Charity Fareham Well.

The Fareham Well is a Christian based charity that will be making grants to local organisations supporting people in need within the community in Fareham
